# Background and objectives

## Exchange of Knowledge

QUARISMA is funded by the IAPP (Industry-Academia Partnerships and Pathways) Programme, which is an element of the specific Programme Marie-Curie Actions of the EU 7th Framework Programme.

Researchers from Academia will be seconded to Industrial partners vice versa. After the exchange period, they go back to their home institution. Hence there will be a double transfer of knowledge and expertise between Industry and Academia.

The research focus is linked to evaluation and education methods as well as integrated strategies of competent networking and innovation management.

## Information work packages

QUARISMA has three interrelated research priority areas, which can be identified (see figure). These areas are:

- Chain management,
- Quality and information management and
- Risk management and food safety.

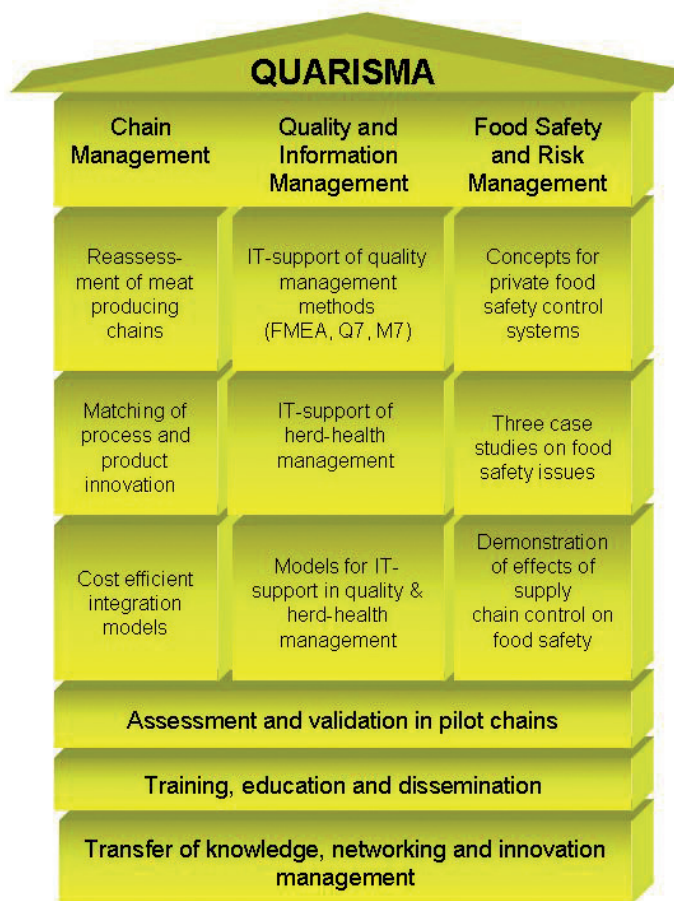
The transfer of knowledge to different actors in the field of expert of Quarisma is organized in the three horizontal work packages:

- Assessing and validation in pilot chains,
- Training, education and dissemination and
- Transfer of knowledge, networking and innovation management.

The “Chain Management” work package will develop concepts for re-assessment of meat producing chains, guidelines for matching of process and product innovation in meat production and costs efficient integration models in meat supply chains.

In work package 2: “Quality and Information Management” guidelines for IT support of quality management, guidelines for IT support of herd-management and models for the integration IT support in quality & herd management systems in meat supply chains will be developed.

New concepts for private food safety control systems will be designed in the work package “Food Safety and Risk



Management”. In addition, three case studies on food safety issues in meat supply chains will be conducted and a demonstration of the effects of a supply chain control programme on food safety will be held during the running time of the project.
